Evaluation Team Leader (ETL) for GA’s Healthcare Science Education Industry Certification, with Teacher panel Sharon Norman, EdS., MEd, RN, is the Coordinator/Evaluation Team Leader (ETL) for Georgia’s Healthcare Science Education Industry Certification. In this role, she reviews the showcasing of the high standards of education and training by the approved Georgia’s high school Healthcare Science Education programs through workshops and activities. In 1998, the Georgia Department of Education requested that Sharon Norman design and implement a healthcare industry certification/accreditation program to establish and accredit Healthcare Science Education programs in the Georgia high schools. As the curriculum standards have changed and have been updated by groups of healthcare professionals, Sharon Norman has continued to support the process with updating the materials provided to the teachers to use as they provide the supporting documentation for certification. Additionally, she has provided teacher trainings with year-long support, and leading the certifications with local healthcare professionals (industry) across the state of Georgia since 1999. She previously served as the Director/CEO for the Blue Ridge Area Health Education Center (AHEC) for 19 years in Northwest Georgia, with a goal to connect students to health careers, professionals to communities, and communities to better health by improving the quality, education, supply, distribution and retention of health care professionals. She partnered with local communities and educators to recruit students into health careers, assist health care students in gaining a quality educational experience, and providing retention activities to current health care professionals.
